2024-25 Main focus for Leadership and Management

- Carefully costed building maintenance plans to mitigate risk, ensuring the schools are safe. Prioritise and plan budgets in connection with this. Staff to use Safe Smart Softwear.
- Develop Low Halls out door furniture, so that it is durable and sustainable, offering high quality play. Gradually buy Community playthings Outlast £17k over 5 years (to match the similar spend at Church Hill Nursery School in the last financial year)
- Plan extension of two year hours over this academic year including admission changes. 30 hour provision for September 25 with consideration for wrap around care for this group. We are restricted by size. If we were to consider younger children or larger groups of two year olds we will need to extend. We have raised this with Waltham Forest through our governors meetings.
- Revisit the federation's schools vision and values. Governors to have a deeper understanding of strengths and weakness of schools finance.
- Develop partnerships working with WWP, neighbouring maintained nursery schools and other EY providers. Continue to work with LBWF officers to the raise the profile of our high quality provision.
- Developing CPD strategies, including the sharing of the SDP, staff reflection points, CPD technology strategies and appraisal. We have created an online FANS learning library and we want transition to a paperless work environment. Job descriptions to be reflected on as part of this process.
